

Final Presentations

1. You will have roughly five minutes to present, followed by 3-5 minutes of questions from the class. You should time yourself when you practice to make sure that you will fit into the allotted time.
2. Attendance is mandatory for everyone at both classes. You will be graded on your presentation as well as your participation with the presentations of others.
3. You should prepare a powerpoint presentation (roughly 1-2 slides) and email them to me a few hours prior to the class at the latest.
4. The presentation should cover (at a minimum) the following:
 - a. It should contain your thesis statement.
 - b. It should contain the main objection to the argument that you are explaining/evaluating.
 - c. It should briefly describe whether you think the philosopher can or cannot adequately respond to the objection.
 - d. It can contain whatever else you think would make for a helpful presentation.

The general purpose of these presentations is to serve as review for the final & to get you started on thinking carefully about your paper topics. Hopefully you will receive useful feedback from the class to help you write a better paper.
